

MERCED IRRIGATION DISTRICT

ELECTRIC SERVICE SCHEDULE LSC
STREET LIGHTING - CUSTOMER OWNED AND MAINTAINED

APPLICABILITY:

This schedule is applicable to lighting service for the illumination of public streets, alleys, highways and other publicly-dedicated outdoor places. It is available to cities, counties, lighting districts or other public bodies where the District supplies electrical energy only, and the customer furnishes, installs, owns, operates and completely maintains lighting units including switching and all other associated equipment.

CHARACTER OF SERVICE:

Alternating current; frequency of approximately 60 hertz; single-phase; delivery will be made at such nominal voltage as customer selects from among those the District designates as available at the customer’s location. Lamps shall be controlled to operate from dusk to dawn each night so as to give approximately 4,100 hours of lighting service annually.

TERRITORY SERVED:

The entire area within the Merced Irrigation District service boundary as distribution lines and capacity are developed and declared available by the District.

Mandated Charges (PBP & Local Government Permits & Fees do not exceed 5.35%)

MINIMUM CHARGE:

The minimum charge for each monthly billing period will be the rate as shown above.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS:

1. Luminaries must have ballasts of 90% or above power factor.
2. Mercury vapor lamp service is closed to new installations.
3. Lamp sizes not indicated on the schedule shall be charged the next higher lamp size rate.
4. Rates for sodium vapor lamps are based on high-pressure sodium (HPS) fixtures. The applicable rate for lamps other than HPS shall be determined by comparing the total fixture load to that of an equivalent HPS fixture.
5. Where service is supplied through new electric facilities provided by the District, the electric service supplied shall be in accordance with a contract authorized by the District's Board of Directors.
6. Any customer who reapplies for service within 12 months of canceling that same service must pay, before the new service will be provided, the total Charges that would have otherwise been payable between the prior cancellation date and the new service date.
7. No Customer Charge, Minimum Charge, Energy Charge, (Demand Charge, Power Factor Charge) or any other Charge shall be payable if the customer ceases to have any electric service requirements at the location designated in the customer's Agreement to Provide Electric Services.
8. Mandated Charges: Public Benefits Program (PBP) is mandated by the State of California to provide services to low-income customers and to promote energy conservation and renewable energy sources. This fee is set at the existing rate of the Investor Owned Utilities, presently at 2.85%. Local Government Permits and Fees vary, but do not exceed 2.5%.
